

## **KEN DAVEY**

After undergraduate and master degrees at University of Western Ontario, Ken Davey did his PhD in insect physiology in Cambridge, England, returning there after a brief postdoctoral fellowship at the U of T. He returned to Canada in 1963 as Director of the Institute of Parasitology at McGill, moved to York in 1974 where he was successively Chair of Biology, Dean of Science and VP (Academic). His research has dealt generally with the

neuroendocrinology of insects and parasitic worms. This work has earned him three Gold Medals from national and international societies. He has served on review panels for NSERC, NIH, NCE, CIHR, CFI and CHSRF, as well as on various policy committees. He has recently completed a term of nine years as Editor of the Canadian Journal of Zoology, and is currently a member of the editorial board of the Monographs Series of the NRC Press. Among his honours are FRSC, FESC, Officer of the Order of Canada and an honorary degree from University of Western Ontario.
